Indonesia is a close neighbour and an important partner in our bilateral, regional and global interests. A prosperous, stable and growing Indonesia is good for regional stability, security, trade and cooperation. Australia works with Indonesia to target the fundamental constraints to its growth and poverty reduction.

Strategic direction

Australia's development assistance to Indonesia helps accelerate economic growth and stability by improving competitiveness and strengthening the impact of Indonesia's resources. Our economic partnership with Indonesia has three key objectives:

- effective economic institutions and infrastructure;
- human development for a productive and healthy society; and
- an inclusive society through effective governance.

Our work in Indonesia contributes to achieving the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). We do this by: improving the lives of poor women through increased access to jobs, social protection programs and improved conditions for overseas work (SDG 5); improved access to water and sanitation (SDG 6) and infrastructure (SDG 9); and promoting inclusive growth by increasing incomes for smallholder farmers (SDG 8).

We will offer 940 new **Australia Awards** for Indonesian students to study in Australia in 2017. In 2016-17 we had **85 Australian Volunteers for International Development** working in Indonesia.

Program highlights

In 2017, Australia helped:

- target electricity subsidies to the poorest 40 per cent of households, saving the Indonesian Government the equivalent of AUD 1.6 billion.
- expand financial services and increase financial inclusion for Indonesians not covered by major banks through new financial technology regulation.
- improve Indonesian Government budgeting, including through the introduction of multi-year budgeting in 87 agencies.
- establish a public-private partnership office in the Indonesian Government to accelerate the delivery of infrastructure.
- increase incomes for 44,000 small farming households.
- enable more than 50,000 women to contribute to policy and decision making in their communities.
- expand to 140 villages in 50 districts a program providing better services to migrant workers (mostly women) and their families.
