### Overview of additional appropriations

The Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade is seeking a net increase of \$235.1 million in Appropriation Bill No. 3 for 2022-23.

#### Departmental items

- \$144.0 million for Passport production funding arrangement;
- \$1.2 million for Other Program adjustments;
- \$0.5 million for Departmental Capital Budget; and
- \$0.3 million for Australia's participation in Osaka Expo 2025.

#### Administered items

• \$89.1 million for Australia's participation in Osaka Expo 2025.

**Note 2:** Departmental and Administered Capital Budgets are appropriated through Appropriation Acts (No.1,3,5). They form part of ordinary annual services and, are not separately identified in the Appropriation Acts. The 2022-23 Additional Estimates Appropriation Bill No.3 included a Departmental Capital Budget component of \$528 (\$'000) for 2022-23 Revised and \$528 (\$'000) for Additional Estimates.

**Note 3:** The Reduced Estimates column includes any appropriation reductions not previously reported in the 2022-23 October Budget. As appropriations in an Appropriation Act cannot be negative, any negative appropriation amounts are quarantined against an existing Appropriation Act.

The above Reduced Estimates includes \$8,537 (\$'000) subject to administrative quarantine or withheld under section 51 of the *Public Governance, Performance and Accountability Act 2013 (PGPA Act)*.
