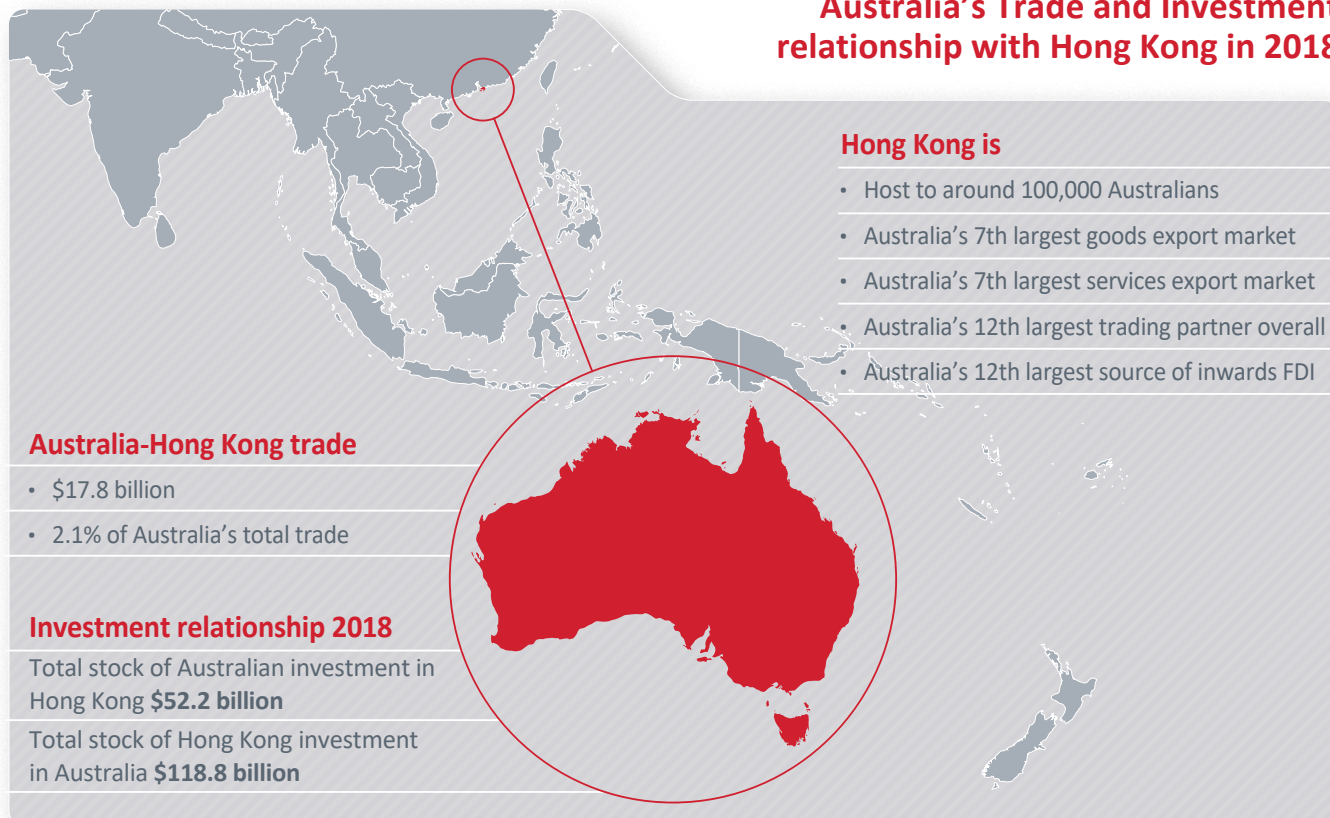


Australia's Trade and Investment relationship with Hong Kong in 2018
