AUD120m 2021-26

Partnership for Human Development improves quality and access to services in health, basic education and social protection.



AUD65m 2012-22

R4D works with Timor-Leste's government to manage its rural road network, providing benefits to communities through improved road access and employment.



AUD27.5m 2018-23

Timor-Leste Police Development Program supports the delivery of skilled, professional policing services which respond to community need and internal security.



AUD19m 2013-22

The Market Development Facility works with the private sector to grow the Timor-Leste economy, partnering together in sectors with the potential to generate jobs and income earning opportunities.



Pacific Labour Facility provides technical and operational support to SEFOPE to grow Timor-Leste's participation in the Pacific Australia Labour Mobility (PALM) program.

PARTISIPA works with Timor-Leste's government to deliver community-driven infrastructure, improve rural water supply and strengthen municipal administration.

Nabilan works to ensure women and children in Timor-Leste live free from violence, supporting violence prevention in communities and essential services for survivors of violence.

Australian Humanitarian Partnership

AUD6.55m 2017-2022

Disaster READY (under the AHP) supports Australian NGOs to deliver disaster preparedness and readiness programs in Timor-Leste.



AUD66m 2022-2030

PROSIVU works with government to support sustainable public financial management, inclusive economic growth and better public administration.



AUD30m 2016-22

TOMAK supports agricultural market systems development, food security and the nutrition of rural households through improved farming and nutrition practices.



AUD27m 2020-22

Direct Budget Support to fund Timor-Leste's Programa Nasional Dezenvolvimentu Suku and the Bolsa da Mae Jersaun Foun program. A further budget package is currently under negotiation.

The AIFFP provides financing and advisory support for transformational infrastructure and is helping to deliver Timor-Leste's first undersea cable connection and critical components of the Nicolau Lobato Airport.
