DESCRIPTION: By 2030, estimates suggest cities will be both home to two-thirds of the world's population and the intersection of people, food, energy, and water. Yet the rate of urbanization has outpaced the ability of cities to create or scale up the infrastructure necessary to deliver food, water, and energy to their residents. Gaps in essential services exacerbate urban poverty and pose severe health risks to urban residents who have seen a rise in non-communicable (NCDs) and infectious diseases. Furthermore, these gaps severely hamper economic growth: it is

estimated \$30 trillion will be lost in economic opportunity over the next 20 years due to the rise of non-communicable diseases, while the Ebola crisis may cost up to \$25 billion in lost GDP for West Africa in 2015 alone.

In this session, leaders from the private, public, and civil society sectors will discuss how CGI members can:

- Recognize the link between human health and sustainability – two traditionally siloed development areas.
- Create sustainable delivery systems that fulfill CGI's Calls to Action and mitigate the rise of NCDs and infectious diseases in cities.
- Design incentives that motivate residents and organizations to invest in creating healthier social and physical environments.
