This Partnership Agreement records the terms of an agreement reached between the Commonwealth of Australia represented by the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade ("DFAT") and **Brent Draper** (the "Partner") under which the Partner is to participate in Taste of Australia (TOA) 2024 event as described in **Clause 2** below (the "Services").

If you wish to accept this Partnership Agreement, you **must** sign and return the Partnership Agreement to DFAT by email or mail before the commencement of the Services or within five (5) working days of the Sent Date, whichever is the earlier.

1. COMMENCEMENT AND COMPLETION

1.1 The Partner must commence the partnership upon the signed date of this Agreement. The partnership will end upon the completion of the agreed Services.

2. SERVICES

2.1 The Partner must attend and participate in events for the Taste of Australia 2024 as Campaign Ambassador from 19 to 26 June in Jakarta and Surabaya, in accordance with the agreed schedule.

Surabaya programs, 20 – 22 June 2024:

- a) Availability of Mr Brent Draper to attend Taste of Australia dinner or participate in the tour of Surabaya activity for Embassy social media content.
- b) Availability of Mr Brent Draper to perform a cooking demo and discussion with hospitality students at Ciputra University.
- c) Availability of Mr Brent Draper to perform a cooking demo as part of the kitchen / Supermarket takeover activity.
- d) Availability of Mr Brent Draper to participate in media engagement activities in Surabaya as part of the promotion of TOA 2024, including but not limited to interviews and other media activities (print, TV and digital) as required.



Jakarta programs, 22 – 26 June 2024:

- e) Availability of Mr Brent Draper to perform a cooking demo at the 75th Anniversary BBQ Festival, including delivering short remarks (3 minutes) during the event and participating in a media doorstop.
- f) Availability of Mr Brent Draper to participate in the in Embassy's social media activities: Coffee tour and Kitchen takeover, including perform a cooking demo as part of the kitchen takeover activity. This event May include a media partnership.
- g) Availability of Mr Brent Draper to perform a cooking demo and discussion with hospitality students at Bina Nusantara University, including a possible media doorstop.
- h) Availability of Mr Brent Draper to perform a cooking demo and discussion with hospitality students at Podomoro University, including a possible media doorstop.
- i) Availability of Mr Brent Draper to participate in a cooking demo to be recorded and broadcast by an Indonesian media/television company with Australian Embassy representative, including a media doorstop.
- j) Availability of Mr Brent Draper to attend the networking dinner event. This event will be open for alumni chefs, business owners in Indonesia and food influencers.

2.2 Media

Availability of Mr Brent Draper to participate, with the support of the Embassy, in the above described media engagement activities in Surabaya and Jakart as part of the promotion of TOA 2024, including but not limited to interviews and other media activities (print, TV and digital) as required.

3. CHILD PROTECTION

- 3.1 The Partner must comply with the DFAT Child Protection Compliance Standards, which are specified in Attachment 1 of the Child Protection Policy accessible on the DFAT website www.dfat.gov.au.
- 3.2 DFAT may audit the Partner's compliance with the DFAT Child Protection Policy and Child Protection Compliance Standards. The Partner must participate cooperatively in any reviews conducted by DFAT.
- 3.3 If the Child Protection Officer finds that the Partner has failed to comply with the Child Protection Compliance Standards, the Partner must promptly, and at the cost of the Partner, take such actions as are required to ensure compliance with the Compliance Standards.
- 3.4 The Partner must sign and return to DFAT, the Child Protection Code of Conduct at **Schedule 1** to this Partnership Agreement.

4. BASIS OF PAYMENT

- 4.1 The maximum amount payable by DFAT to the Partner for the provision of the Services shall not exceed the sum of AUD 12,000 plus GST.
 - DFAT shall not be liable for any costs or expenditure incurred by the Partner in excess of this amount,

except for any additional cost to be made related to the provision of service that is pre-approved by the First Secretary – Public Diplomacy of the Australian Embassy Jakarta.

- 4.2 DFAT shall arrange and bear the cost required to perform activities mentioned in Clause 2.1 for the attendance of the Partner as follows:
 - Two (2) return international airfares economy class: Gold Coast Jakarta Gold Coast
 - Domestic airfares economy class: Jakarta Surabaya Jakarta
 - Two (2) Visa fee
 - Travel insurance (DFAT Comcover)
 - Accommodation in Jakarta and Surabaya from 19 26 June 2024
 - Ground transport in Jakarta and Surabaya for official events during from 19 26 June 2024



SCHEDULE 1 – DFAT CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

I, Brent Draper agree that while implementing DFAT-funded aid activities, I will:

- treat children with respect regardless of race, colour, sex, language, religion, political or other opinion, national, ethnic or social origin, property, disability, birth or other status
- not use language or behaviour towards children that is inappropriate, harassing, abusive, sexually provocative, demeaning or culturally inappropriate
- not engage children in any form of sexual activity or acts, including paying for sexual services or acts
- wherever possible, ensure that another adult is present when working in the proximity of children
- not invite unaccompanied children into my home, unless they are at immediate risk of injury or in physical danger
- not sleep close to unsupervised children unless absolutely necessary, in which case I must obtain my supervisor's permission, and ensure that another adult is present if possible
- use any computers, mobile phones, or video and digital cameras appropriately, and never to exploit or harass children or to access child pornography through any medium (see also 'Use of children's images for work related purposes')
- refrain from physical punishment or discipline of children (excluding my own children)
- refrain from hiring children for domestic or other labour which is inappropriate given their age or developmental stage, which interferes with their time available for education and recreational activities, or which places them at significant risk of injury
- comply with all relevant Australian and local legislation, including labour laws in relation to child labour
- immediately report concerns or allegations of child abuse in accordance with appropriate procedures.

Use of children's images for work related purposes

When photographing or filming a child for work related purposes, I must:

- before photographing or filming a child, assess and endeavour to comply with local traditions or restrictions for reproducing personal images
- before photographing or filming a child, obtain consent from the child or a parent or guardian of the child. As part of this I must explain how the photograph or film will be used
- ensure photographs, films, videos and DVDs present children in a dignified and respectful manner and not in a vulnerable or submissive manner. Children should be adequately clothed and not in poses that could be seen as sexually suggestive
- ensure images are honest representations of the context and the facts
- ensure file labels do not reveal identifying information about a child when sending images electronically.

I understand that the onus is on me to use common sense and avoid actions or behaviours that could be construed as child abuse when implementing DFAT-funded activities.

Good afternoon (between 3pm and 6pm) Selamat sore (sla-maht sor-ray)

You're welcome Sama-sama (sa-ma sa-ma)

Goodbye (when you are the person leaving) Selamat tinggal (sla-maht ting-gaal)
