CYBER AND TECH RETREAT 2024 TOGETHER TOWARDS A RESPONSIBLE TECHNOLOGY FUTURE

Co-Chairs Report

SUMMARY

The growing global network of cyber and tech ambassadors is a testimony to the increasingly profound impact of cyberspace and critical and emerging technologies on the foreign and security policy landscape. Tech and digital diplomacy has become a discipline on par with traditional diplomatic work, and in recent years' the challenging geopolitical environment has demonstrated its value whether on AI governance, multilateral technology collaboration or cyber diplomacy.

On 8 – 10 May 2024, Australia and Denmark co-chaired the fourth Cyber and Tech Retreat in San Francisco, bringing together 30 senior tech diplomats representing governments and NATO, tech companies, academics, think tanks, investors and senior industry leaders to discuss how the rapid development of technology require states to consider how new and emerging technologies will impact foreign, security, social, political and economic interests.

Participants met at a pivotal time with 2024 being a crucial year of elections, UN negotiations on the Global Digital Compact, the AI governance super year and increased geostrategic competition for global tech supremacy. Under the theme "Together Towards a Responsible Technology Future", the Retreat brought together leading cyber and tech ambassadors with representatives of cutting edge tech companies to forge strong public-private tech diplomatic collaborations to address emerging challenges, nationally and internationally. As such, the conversations emphasised the importance of trusted and open cooperation between governments and the tech industry to address global tech governance issues and ensuring emerging technologies are responsibly designed, developed and deployed to maximise the opportunities and minimise the risks.

It is our hope that this year's co-chairs report once again will serve as an inspirational catalogue of relevant topics for our work the coming year and serve as a reminder of the strength of public-private partnership in advancing global tech diplomacy.
