Research

Accommodation and conference facilities

We explored a range of accommodation and conference options in Cairns, Port Douglas and Palm Cove. There were 3 locations that met our requirements, click the links below for the quotes:

- Sheraton Port Douglas
- Hilton Cairns
- Pullmans Port Douglas (pdf quote attached to email)

We think the Sheraton is the best option because it has everything we need to give the delegates an amazing Australian experience. The resort setting is spectacular, with the rooms surrounded by lagoon

pools and tropical gardens. The complex also backs onto Port Douglas's famous 4 mile beach. The rooms are luxurious and the hotel can guarantee that all delegates get a similar room. The conference will be held on site and they have all the necessary facilities, such as catering and AV equipment. The hotel has excellent bar and restaurant facilities that are perfect for our cocktail reception welcome event and group dinner. The resort is located about 3 kilometres from the centre of Port Douglas. The hotel offers a free shuttle bus service for guests to and from the central restaurant and shopping precinct. We will charter a bus to transport delegates to and from Cairns and our group activities.

We also have some concerns about delegate safety given the

high crime rate in Cairns.

The Pullmans Port Douglas is a good second option, however we feel the Sheraton is the better option. Pullmans have a limited number of studio and 1 bedroom apartments. Delegates will have different style rooms and some will have 2 bedroom apartments with the 2nd bedroom blocked off. The resort facilities are better at Sheraton and the rooms are not as spread out. When we were showed around the Pullmans we were driven in a golf cart as the rooms were spread around the resort.

We explored the Tjapukai Cultural Park and Conference Centre as a venue for our conference. The venue is too large for the number of delegates. $\frac{847C(1)}{1000}$ The centre is located about 20 minutes out of Cairns and is not as convenient as having the accommodation and conference in the same location.

Activities

We road tested several activities and events. We feel that Hartley's Wildlife Park and Mossman Gorge will give the delegates a truly Australian experience. They will see crocodiles and native wildlife and have their photo taken with a koala at Hartley's. At Mossman Gorge they will learn about indigenous history and culture from an indigenous guide. They will have the option of a cooling dip in the gorge after the tour.
