

AUSTRALIAN OPEN - PACIFIC SHOWCASE

Australian Government

The Albanese Government is adopting a whole-of-government approach to secure Australia's position on the global stage. Tennis Australia recognises that this strategy involves collaborating with Pacific neighbors as partners and equals while also deepening connections with countries in Asia. The Australian Government acknowledges that Australia's prosperity, security, and economic future are closely linked to its regional relationships. By focusing on building strong relations with Pacific nations, the government aims to strengthen the "Pacific family" and enhance regional stability and cooperation.

In June 2024, Tennis Australia warmly welcomed the Albanese Government's decision to update the Sports Diplomacy 2030 strategy. This update is intended to maximize Australia's benefits from the "green and gold decade," a period characterised by a series of major sporting events leading up to the Brisbane 2032 Olympic and Paralympic Games. The revised strategy aims to harness the opportunities presented by these events to enhance Australia's international standing and diplomatic relationships.

Craig Tiley, CEO of Tennis Australia, highlighted the profound impact of sport in his remarks on the announcement. He stated, "The emotion, drama, and humanity of sport have a unique power to bring people together like few other things can." Tiley noted that major sporting events, such as the Australian Open, have a remarkable ability to captivate global audiences and forge shared experiences that transcend national and cultural boundaries. He emphasised that by leveraging the unifying power of sport, Australia can foster connections with other nations on a deeper level, building bridges and promoting goodwill among diverse communities worldwide.

Tiley also underscored the unparalleled capacity of sport to open doors and create opportunities. He asserted that Tennis Australia's expertise should be strategically utilised by the Australian government to strengthen both national and personal relationships. This approach would be particularly effective in engaging the Asia-Pacific-Oceania regions, impacting both community and elite levels. Furthermore, it presents a valuable opportunity to boost tourism, trade, and investment, enhancing Australia's global profile and influence.

Tennis Australia partners with the Australian Government, through the SportAus program to advance opportunities for women and girls in the Pacific. The 2025 Australian Open provides a unique opportunity for the Albanese Government to once again leverage the opportunity to bring together key stakeholders across Oceania and Asia, to promote gender equality and celebrate the advancement of gender equality in the Pacific region.

Proposal overview

Tennis Australia, has a longstanding commitment to the Oceania region, supporting nations through collaborations, sharing/provision of expertise, and delivery of grant programs enabling participation and equipment.

Tennis Australia welcomes the Oceania Tennis Federation Board members to the Australian Open and will be hosting the Asian Tennis Federation board meeting. Tennis Australia will support with accommodation and access to the Australian Open.

During this time, the 14 & Under Elite trophy involving the top eight boys and girls from the Oceania region, will be played at Melbourne Park. Alongside this, eleven women participating in the Pacific



Women Leaders in Tennis Program will be at Melbourne Park for the completion of the program and graduation.

With many Pacific and Asian guests in Australia, it serves as a unique opportunity to bring everyone together to strengthen relationships, celebrate collaboration and promote gender equality.

Sport diplomacy event 2025

Off the back of a successful 2024 collaboration with the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT) and Victorian Government, Tennis Australia is seeking support to deliver the Pacific sports diplomacy event again during Australian Open 2025 on Tuesday 21st January.

The proposed event will support Australia's foreign policy interests in the Pacific and public diplomacy objectives and is consistent with the objectives identified by DFAT's Sports Diplomacy 2030 Strategy.

It will also recognise and celebrate Australia's Gender Equality and Women's Empowerment Strategy (2016) which states that Australia's international engagement must place a central focus on the advancement of women and their participation in decision-making and articulates Australia's ambition to be recognised as a global leader in international engagement that prioritises women.

In the format of a three-course dinner, the event will bring together leaders in Tennis from across the region and the Australian commonwealth and state Government to deliver on the following objectives;

Objectives

- Showcase Australia's leadership in sport and gender equality through the Pacific Women and Girls in Tennis program supported through the Australian Governments PacificAus program.
- Build and strengthen international relationships
- Celebrate collaborations across the region

This event will promote Australia as a trusted leader in the region and foster continued collaboration, and friendship.
