*If asked: ONI-led urgent climate risk assessment of the implications of climate change for national security*

- Australia's updated Nationally Determined Contribution to the UNFCCC included a commitment to "an urgent climate risk assessment of the implications of climate change for national security, which will be an enduring feature of Australia's climate action".
- The Government has commissioned the Office of National Intelligence to undertake an assessment of the implications of climate change for Australia's national security.
- This will follow the established process and format for other National Assessments:
  - developed with input from across Government
  - focus on international issues and will not make policy recommendations
  - expecting it to be provided to Government by the end of the year.
