Savo Manojlovic, the front man of NGO 'Go-Change' (*Kreni-Promeni*), has stated that his organisation will start collecting signatures for a popular initiative which aims to block the exploitation of lithium in Serbia (closure of the Jadar Project). The campaign will commence on 20 January. Their goal is to submit a popular initiative to the Serbian Parliament by the beginning of February, so that MPs can vote on the initiative before general elections. According to Manojlovic 3,000 volunteers have applied so far to collect signatures. At least 30,000 signatures will be required before citizens can demand a binding vote on this proposed policy by Parliament.

Two SNS MPs have already come out publicly about the 'Go-Change' campaign, stating that they will be signing the popular initiative. The two MPs are Bratislav Jugovic (member of the main board of SNS) and Dr Ljubisa Stojimirovic (one of the founders of SNS). Both gentlemen claim that a majority of MPs are similarly disposed.

Today, the representative of the 'Go – Change' movement, Savo Manojlovic, requested the abolition of the Spatial Plan of the special purpose area for the Jadar Project [and the opening of a lithium mine in Serbia] and the introduction of a moratorium on lithium and borate exploitation for 20 years.

At a press conference in front of the building of the Government of Serbia, Manojlovic stated that the Spatial Plan for the Jadar Project was adopted because of the company Rio Tinto and that it is the legal basis for the company's business in Serbia. "If this spatial plan does not exist, there is no legal obligation for Serbia to compensate Rio Tinto," Manojlovic said.

He said that a lot of irregularities were found in the Spatial Plan: it does not contain valid data on the life of the mine, a feasibility study has not been done and there are no studies on the ore reserves. Manojlovic pointed out that the potential revocation of permits granted to Rio Tinto for exploration in Serbia, which was mentioned by representatives of the government, will not affect that company because they will certainly expire soon, and the exploration is complete.

Commenting on the statement of the President of Serbia, Aleksandar Vucic, that a moratorium on that project should be put in place for a duration of one year, Manojlovic stated that it was said in order to calm down the situation before the upcoming elections. "The government and the Assembly have to implement our requests in a concrete way by 20 January 20, otherwise we will start collecting 30,000 signatures for the people's initiative," he pointed out.

Dragana Djordjevic, scientific advisor at the Institute of Chemistry, Technology and Metallurgy of the University of Belgrade, supported the initiative presented by Manojlovic, explaining that the state allows activities harmful to the environment and destroys the highest quality areas of Serbia. "The Ministry of Environmental Protection gave permission last summer to prepare an Environmental Impact Assessment, even though Rio Sava (a subsidiary of Rio Tinto) did not meet all the requirements, and the planned technology is dangerous for the environment," she stressed.

Representatives of 'Go – Change' handed over 290,000 signatures to the Government of Serbia for the petition entitled "Rio Tinto, leave the Drina".

On 20 January, Serbia's Prime Minister Ana Brnabic advised of the Serbian Government's decision to revoke Rio Tinto's licenses to explore and mine lithium. Prime Minister Brnabic stated "we have fulfilled all the demands from the environmental protests and have put an end to Rio Tinto in the Republic of Serbia," and "all decisions [linked to the lithium project] and all licences have been annulled".

This decision comes on the back of a referendum held on Sunday 16 January, where constitutional amendments, primarily focused on judicial independence needed as part of Serbia's bid to join the EU, were proposed, and accepted by voters. Whilst the vote was supportive (60.48% voted yes), voter turn out was low (approx. 30%) and according to

preliminary results, voters in Belgrade voted against the proposed changes (54%). s 33(a)(iii)
