Many commentators have a pessimistic view of the state of Canada-China relations fifty years on and have called for a new approach to replace the Trudeau Government's earlier policy of economic opportunity and enhanced engagement  $$^{$47E(d)}$$ . Conservative thinktank the MacDonald Laurier Institute (MLI) has called for a 'course-correction' to a foreign policy approach that was adrift and directionless. Speaking at a separate seminar October, author and commentator Jonathan Manthorpe argued that successive Canadian governments had been 'grossly negligent' on China. He claimed that the policy elite had clung for too long to a misguided belief that Canada was unique, that the CCP had a soft spot for Canada and that Ottawa was therefore uniquely placed to influence reform in China.
