#### **Recent Ministerial Comments**

On 20 September 2023, the Minister for Foreign Affairs responded to questions about the parliamentary delegation and Mr Assange's case in the context of the Australia-US Alliance at a press conference during UN General Assembly High Level Week in New York.

Journalist: As you know, obviously a cross party delegation's in Washington today campaigning for the immediate release of Julian Assange. Is this something that the Prime Minister will be raising with President Biden when he comes here in October? <u>Foreign Minister</u>: Well, we have raised this many times, and if - I'm sorry about the helicopter - for those who might have been at AUSMIN, you know, Secretary Blinken and I both spoke about the fact that we had had a discussion, and the views that the United States has and the views that Australia has. We are consistent in our view that we think this has gone on too long, and the breadth of political representation on this delegation...demonstrates that there are a great many people in Australia who would like to see this matter resolved.
