## ONE SINGLE SUGGESTION...

The new International Development Policy provides an opportunity to break with the past decade and mark a new, clear and constructive direction for Australia's engagement in international development. In order to reinforce this message to all stakeholders, the announcement of the policy should accompanied by renaming the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT) as the Department of Foreign Affairs, Trade and Development (DFATD, or DFAT-D). This would be more than a symbolic change, as it would:

- Reinforce to the **Australian public** that the changes made through the new International Development Policy are significant and lasting
- Ensure that every single mention of the Department in the **media** reinforces development cooperation as a key arm of foreign policy, alongside diplomacy and defence
- Signal unambiguously to **other international players** (regional neighbours and groupings, allies, competitors, international financial institutions and so on) that Australia is stepping up once more to take a serious and constructive approach to development
- Remind departmental management and staff in every working day of the part that
  development cooperation plays in international relations building people-to-people links,
  projecting Australian soft power, contributing to regional stability, and punching above our
  weight as a constructive initiator and supporter of regional and international initiatives and
  movements.
