Funding to address IUU fishing in the Pacific end of investment evaluation – management response

Summary of management response

This evaluation of funding to address Illegal, Unreported and Unregulated (IUU) fishing in the Pacific was conducted for the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT) to inform decision making on possible future investments in this area. DFAT agrees that Australia should continue to support efforts to address IUU fishing and ensure Pacific island countries (PICs) are aware of available Australian support. DFAT agrees that strengthened governance structures, capacity building and gender equality and social inclusion should be prioritised in the design of future investments.
