Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (IA-CEPA)

(entered into force on 5 July 2020)



Helps Australian businesses unlock the vast potential of our economic partnership with Indonesia.



Increases work and holiday visas for Indonesians, helping regional Australia to meet seasonal labour needs.



Over 99 per cent of Australian goods exports to Indonesia became duty free or benefited from significantly improved preferential arrangements.



A \$40 million five-year Economic Cooperation Program (ECP) is supporting investment and market access in agrifood, advanced manufacturing and services (skills).



Provides improved access to the Indonesian market for key Australian agricultural exports and streamlines processes for exporters and importers.



The ECP will help boost bilateral trade and exports to third country markets.



Provides more certainty for Australian companies to bring capital, practical knowledge and technical expertise to important sectors in Indonesia such as education.



The ECP will enable greater market access, more integrated markets and enhanced skills exchange.



Guarantees Australian suppliers of certain technical and vocational education and training can provide services through majority Australian-owned businesses.
