

TIER 2 INDICATOR TECHNICAL NOTE

SEXUAL AND REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH AND RIGHTS (SRHR) CONTRACEPTIVE PROTECTION FROM UNPLANNED PREGNANCIES MADE AVAILABLE THROUGH AUSTRALIAN SUPPORT

Last updated: August 2023

DEFINITION

This indicator is designed to capture the estimated protection provided by family planning (FP) services during a one-year period, based upon the method and volume of all contraceptives whether sold or distributed for free to clients during that period.

This is measured as Couple-Years of Protection (CYP) rather than as people who have received or used family planning products or services. This is because the products and services may have a timeframe that ranges from days to years, and consistent data on the number of persons is not available.

SCOPE

INCLUDES:

 Investments in family planning and reproductive health that use internationally agreed CYP methodologies to calculate the extent of coverage.

EXCLUDES:

- Investments that do not deliver or report on CYP.

CALCULATION METHOD

Implementing partners' reported figures for CYP should be used. Where a partner provides numbers of contraceptives (rather than Couple Years Protection (CYP) figures) in reporting, the CYP figure should be requested of partners, in the first instance. <u>In exceptional circumstances, officers may need to convert contraceptive methods and volumes into CYP. In this event, please seek advice from the Contact Officer in this note.</u>

Pro rata calculation of Australia's contribution is required where the financing of contraceptive protection has been shared with partner governments, international organisations or other donors. Care should be taken to ensure all contributions are calculated in the same currency and that Australia's share is clear in the calculation of the reported result.

DATA SOURCE/S

Reporting against this indicator should draw on standard investment monitoring and reporting documentation.

DISAGGREGATION

Where possible, data should be disaggregated by sex and by the number of clients reached with CYP who have a disability.

WORKED EXAMPLE

DFAT expects services providers to be responsible for converting contraceptive method units and volumes into CYP. In extraordinary circumstances where program managers may be required to undertake this calculation, officers should seek advice from the Contact Officer listed above.
