Since 2012, AMBERO is carrying out the project *Sustainable use of Agro-Biodiversity in Timor-Leste* on behalf of the German organization for international cooperation GIZ (2012-16,  $1.5m \in$ ). AMBERO is responsible for:

- Mainstreaming of (agro)biodiversity in national policies
- Inventory of local traditional knowledge and practices as well as use of indigenous species

- Training courses, public awareness campaigns
- In-situ and ex-situ (gene banks) conservation and propagation of indigenous crop species
- Promotion and training on sustainable farming techniques
- Value chain development and market access

Another project in Timor-Leste, conducted by AMBERO, is called *Advisory and Training for the Maritime Related Industries of Timor-Leste* (GIZ, 2014-16,  $1.2m \in$ ). The objective is to contribute to the strengthening of institutional, legal and personal capacities of maritime management and of vocational training institutions. AMBERO is also contributing to the promotion of female employment by specifically addressing young women.

The third and last GIZ project implemented by AMBERO in Timor-Leste with the title *Peace Development, Youth Promotion and Fight against Corruption* (2014-16, 715.000  $\in$ ) is providing a National Training Program for the Timorese state and non-state youth workers, as well as training and coaching in the field of youth promotion. This will lead to strengthening acknowledgement, a sense of belonging as well as protection and perspectives of social and economic inclusion for young people.

Besides those regional commitments, AMBERO is engaged in different projects worldwide related to the support of more sustainable agricultural practices, establishment of value chains as well as the improvement of livelihoods.

With our partners, AMBERO is implementing in Ethiopia the projects *Sustainable Land Management* (KfW, Phase I 2011-14, 1.3m  $\in$ ; Phase II 2014-16, 1.1m  $\in$ ) and *Livelihoods, Agriculture and National Development* (CIDA/KfW, 2013-16, 1.4m  $\in$ ). It specifically targets "high potential" areas that are increasingly becoming vulnerable to land degradation and food insecurity.
