Vanuatu Kastom Governance Partnership – Phase 3

Annual Plan - Year 2

1 November 2010 to 31 October 2011

This Annual Plan provides a written summary of work planned for each of the four main outputs of the Partnership, followed by an Implementation Schedule of Activities.

1. Research Plan

The Research topics below are the result of discussions and agreement between ACPACS (University of Queensland), MNCC and AusAID during the Phase 3 Design consultations.

Proposed research topics:

- Case studies exploring particular custom judgements, and the values and reasoning behind the decisions. This may also include a comparison of court judgements on the same cases, if available. (Researchers: Volker Boege [University of Queensland]; Selwyn Garu [MNCC]; other UQ and MNCC VKGP researchers, drawn from local facilitators.)
- 2. Custom and Gender extending earlier research on this topic which looked at the contribution of custom to women's safety, participation in community decision-making, and standing within the community. (Researchers: Anne Brown [UQ] and Roslyn Tor [MNCC]; Other UQ and MNCC researchers as necessary.)
- 3. Youth in urban areas exploring affiliations and knowledge of kastom among urban youth, and ways in which customary leaders can support and engage with urban youth (Researchers: Daniel Lukai and others in collaboration with UQ researchers and VKS);
- 4. Environmental resource management and customary governance (Researchers: Mark Love and/or Volker Boege[UQ] in collaboration with MNCC, and in consultation with AusAID Vanuatu on their related research interests for this topic);
- 5. Custom contributions to a peaceful Vanuatu participatory co-research with local facilitators eliciting stories of kastom contributions to peace in Vanuatu. Dissemination of outcomes would explore a variety of forms, including text and song and working with cultural artists in Vanuatu (Researchers: Jason McLeod [UQ], Selwyn Garu and MNCC Facilitators).
- 6. The role of ceremonies in reconciliation of conflicts (Researchers: Polly Walker and/or Volker Boege [UQ], Selwyn Garu and chiefs)
- 7. Analysis of the impact of the VKG *storians* and associated processes on communities through the collection of stories from participants and other community members. This work will feed into the *storians* throughout the life of the partnership and will

contribute to monitoring & evaluation. (Researchers: UQ facilitators/ researcher will support MNCC facilitators as the primary researchers collecting stories from storian participants.)

The Partnership will produce research papers and forum/ seminar presentations on the above topics in Years 2, 3 and 4 (2011-2013). Topics will be reviewed each year in Annual Plans. Further topics for research in subsequent years may be developed through consultation among the partners and with input and approval from the Vanuatu Kastom Reference Group.

Target Audience

This research is oriented to different target audiences:

- The Malvatumauri NCC and their network of customary leaders;
- Participants in the partnership storians and through both them and the MNCC, ni-Vanuatu more generally; the Vanuatu Cultural Centre (VKS);
- Those involved in policy and scholarly debate around the Pacific Islands region;
- Policy makers and practitioners in Australian and other agencies working in the Pacific.

Presentation and Dissemination

This range of different audiences will shape the presentation of the research outcomes to some extent. In addition to the production of scholarly journal articles and conference papers for presentation at international symposia, the VKG Partnership is committed to making research findings available locally in Vanuatu in other forms – including seminars and public forums. Shortened versions of some research papers have been and will continue to be made available in Bislama (through the VKS).

Time line

Field research on topics outlined below will commence in 2011. Tentative dates have been indicated in the Implementation Schedule for Year 2 (see below).

2. Storians

Venues and Themes

Five Storians will continue to be held each year, with the aim of holding 3 storians at each location on each of the themes (Conflict Resolution, Kastom Governance and Community Action) over the life of the Partnership. The Facilitators' storian on Community Development held in November 2010 resolved to rename the Community Development storians as Community Action, to avoid negative misinterpretations by ni-Vanuatu participants, surrounding the term "development". The table below shows the locations for past and future storians according to these 3 themes.

Storians for Year 2 include two activities postponed from Year 1 – the first 5 day Facilitators storian on Community Action (in Port Vila) and the first Community Action storian on Tanna. In addition there are two Kastom Governance storians planned for Port Vila and Luganville and a second Community Action storian planned for Pentecost. This large number of storian activities is challenging (including 2 day Facilitator Refresher storians before each main storian) and may need to be reduced if necessary, to prevent overstretching capacities, as agreed in the project design. It is also possible that MNCC will run an additional 3-5 day storian for the National Council of Chiefs.

UQ and MNCC will collaboratively develop storian programs, content, case studies, role plays and handouts for use in storians; and MNCC will be primarily responsible for scoping and on-location logistical preparation prior to storians.

In Year 2, we will also explore (with the Kastom Reference Group) the possibility of integrating more digital filming of partnership activities, particularly for use in storians.

Timing

Timing for storians is flexible depending on suitable dates for partners and communities. See approx. timing in the Implementation Schedule below.

3. Follow-up

MNCC Facilitators will work on both Follow-up support for storian participants' Action Plans and also conducting Monitoring Interviews (based on Most Significant Change) method several months after each storian (depending on timeframe agreed for the Action Plans to be completed). MNCC Facilitators will also collect stories on an opportunistic basis when they encounter storian participants, community members, and other stakeholders. A UQ facilitator may stay an additional day or two at one or two storians per year for evaluation research on the impact of the storians, depending on costs, availability and logistics. UQ Facilitators will continue to provide mentoring and training for MNCC Facilitators on methods and process for the monitoring interviews conducted during the 2-day Facilitators workshops prior to storians.

4. Management Support for National and Island Councils of Chiefs

MNCC will continue its role in assisting the establishment of Island and Area Councils of Chiefs.

5. Forum

It might be possible to hold a Public Forum or debate during Year 2, but this is not certain, given the large number of activities.
