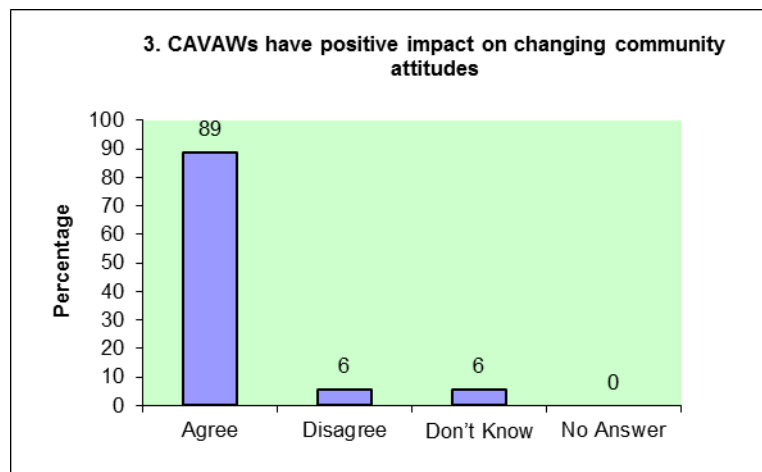

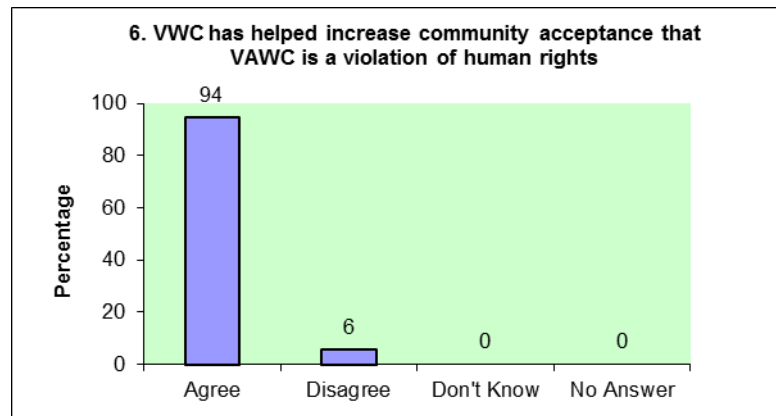
**5) The Male Advocacy Program for Women's Human Rights has helped the community understand that violence against women is a crime**

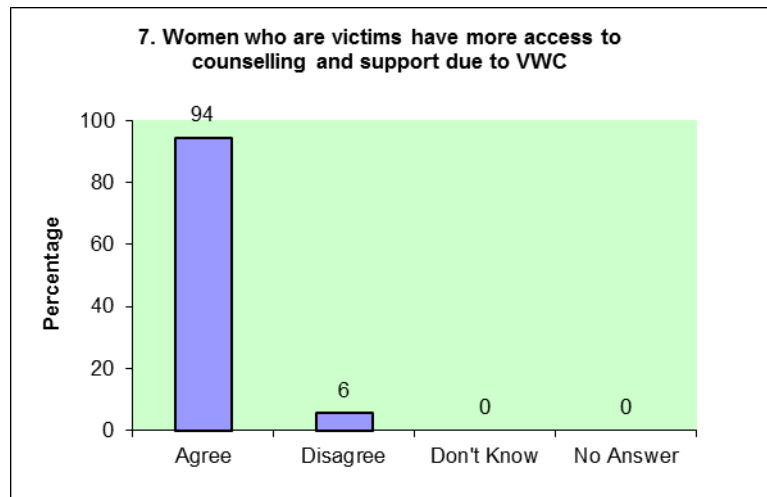

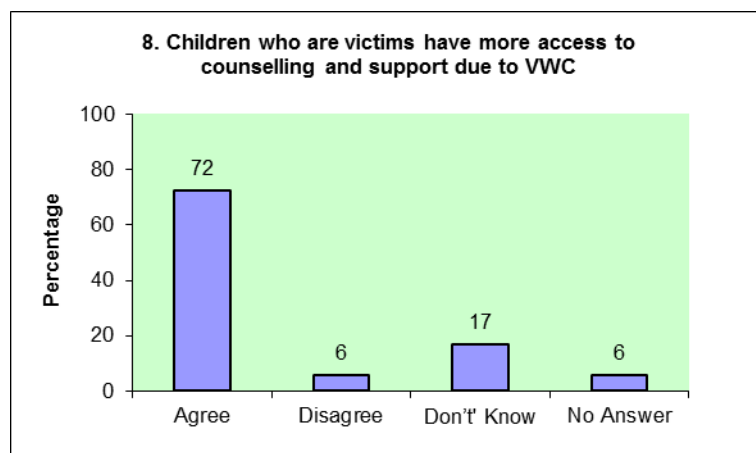
**7) Women who are victims of violence have more access to counselling and support due to VWC**

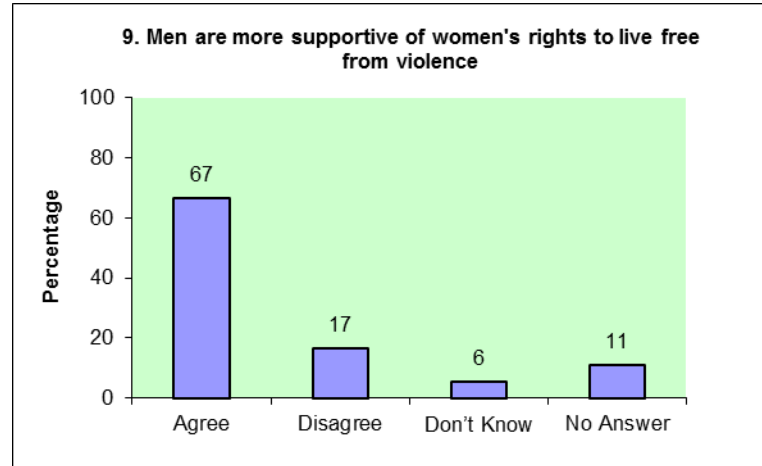
**8) Children who are victims of violence have more access to counselling and support due to VWC**

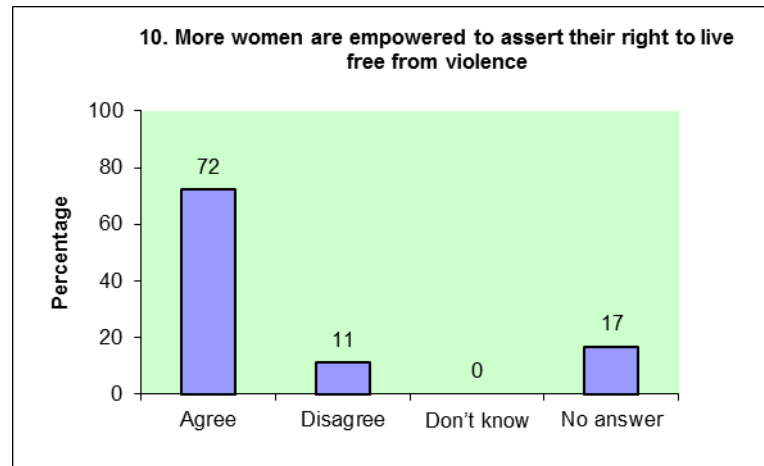
**9) Men are more supportive of women's rights to live free from violence**

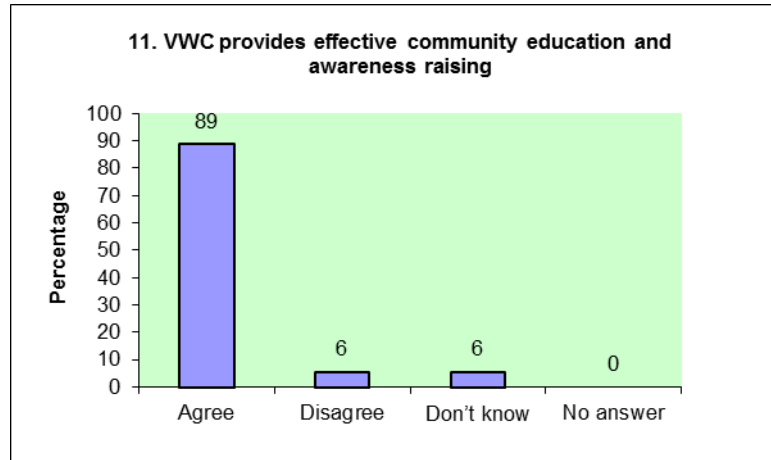
**10) More women are empowered to assert their right to live free from violence**

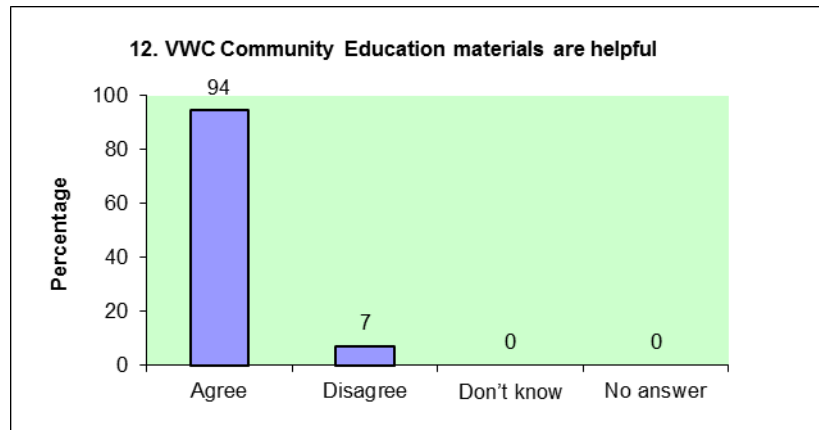

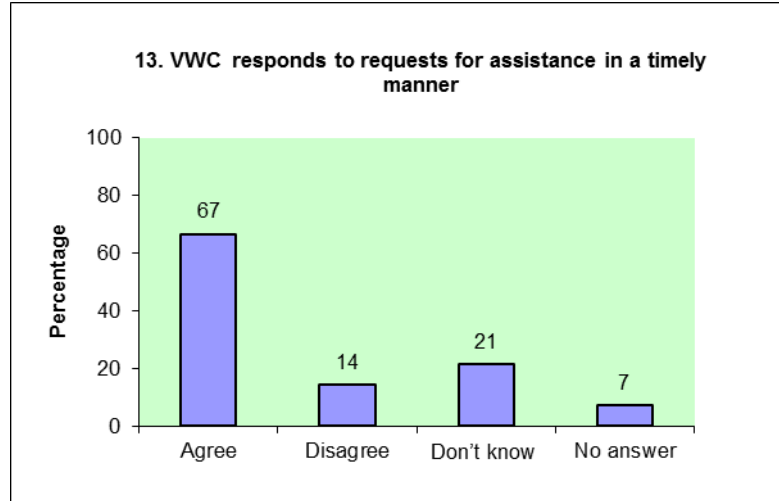

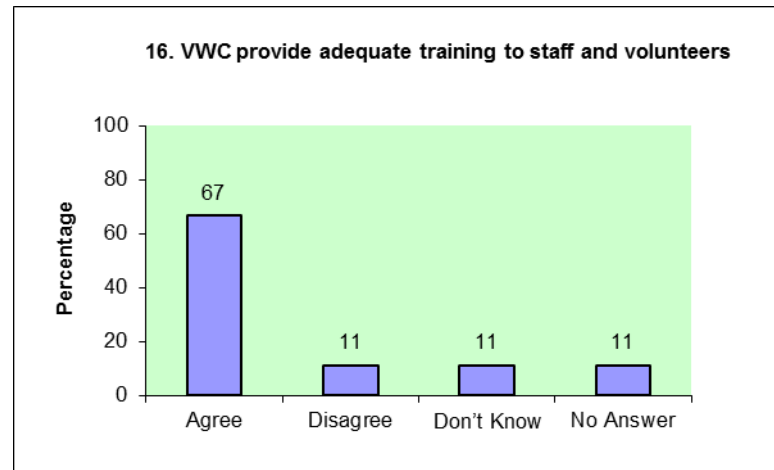

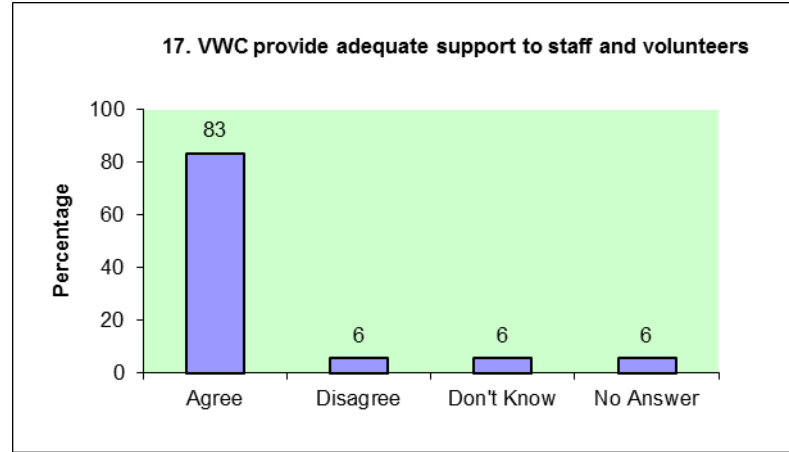

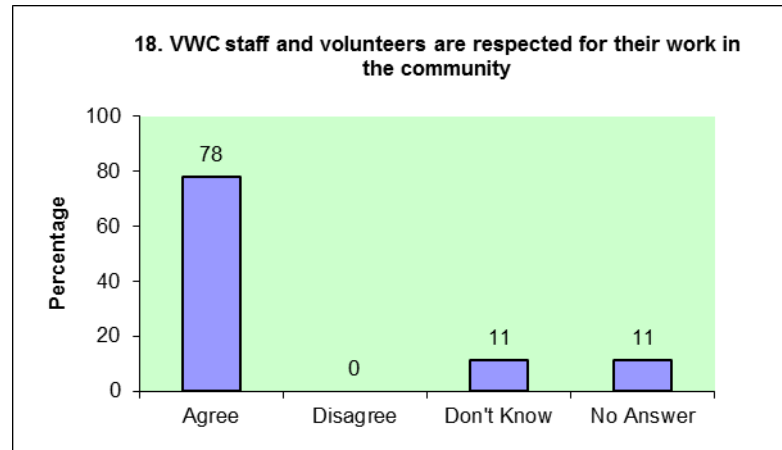
**17) VWC provide adequate support to staff and volunteers**

**18) VWC staff and volunteers are respected for their work in the community**

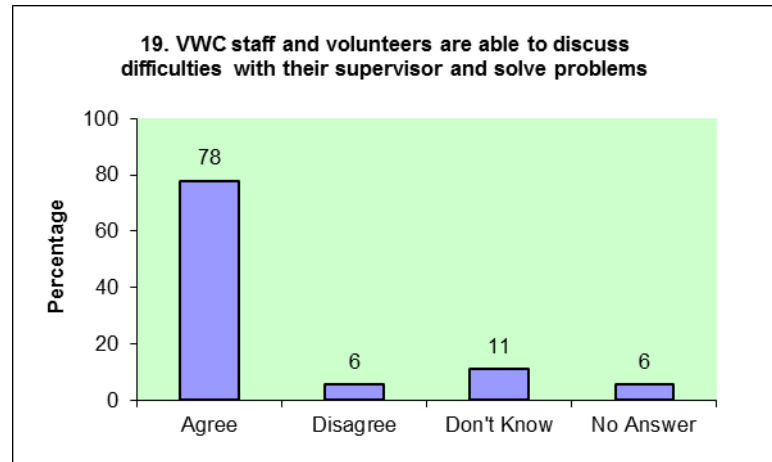

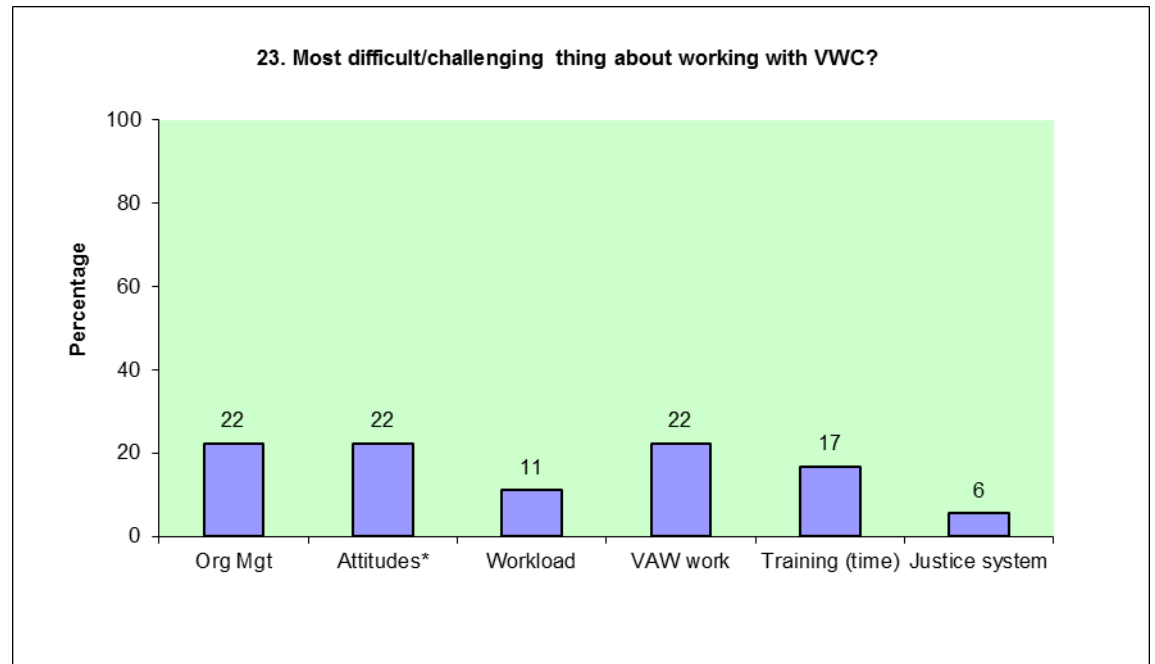

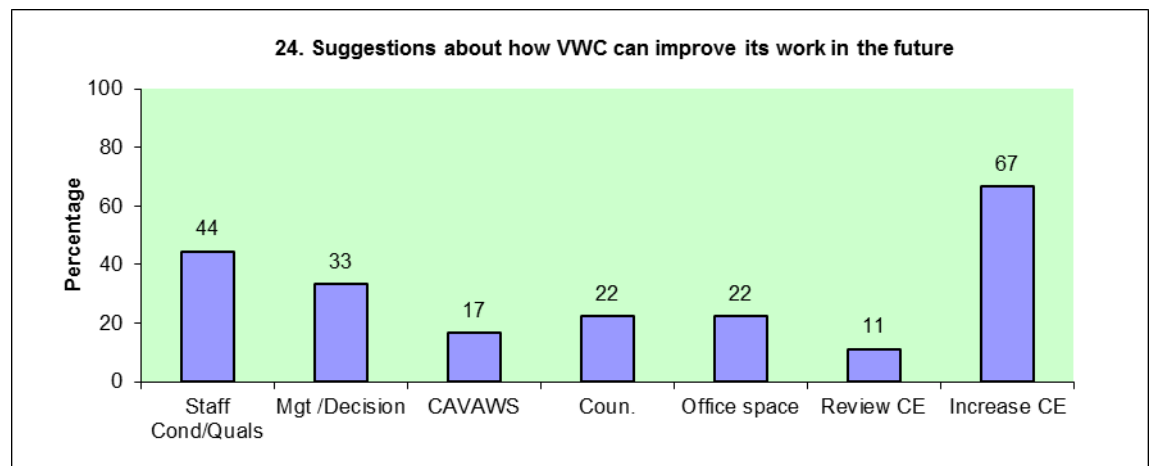
**23) What is the most difficult/challenging thing about working with VWC?**
